An annual review of the fees charged for service have been updated in coordination with the department responsible for providing the service. These fees focus on full cost recovery when possible and balance the social and economic impacts of the fee as well comparison of fees in other surrounding municipalities.

Several fee categories are fixed based on state law and/or fee studies which set the rates until updated by another study (i.e., ambulance fees, court fines, impact fees)
